Message from the President March 24, 2020

STM College community and friends,

The extreme challenge we now face with the spread of the new coronavirus calls for us to think and act in ways that are unfamiliar and uncomfortable. Our college administration continues to meet regularly to assess the ongoing situation with COVID-19 and update our response. Our immediate priority is to support our students in completing the winter term successfully, while ensuring that our faculty and staff can continue their work safely and effectively.

Following the latest enhanced measures instituted by USask to support the health and safety of our campus community, STM will also close our college building as of 4:30 pm, Tuesday, March 24, 2020. All staff and faculty are to be working off site after that time.

As at USask, all STM classes are now being delivered remotely through the remainder of the Winter 2020 term. Final exams in the April 2020 period will also be completed in this mode. Plans are also in place to facilitate spring and summer courses in remote delivery. Spring convocation ceremonies have been postponed. Regular campus updates can be found at updates.usask.ca
