Applications are being accepted for a **Term position** at the **Lecturer** rank, effective July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021.

Particulars of the Position: The Department has teaching needs in the areas of introductory and intermediate Microeconomics and Macroeconomics. The teaching load will be five courses in the fall and winter terms.

The appointment will be made at the rank of Lecturer or Instructor depending on the successful candidate's qualifications.

- sample of **academic writing**
- **at least two letters** of reference (please have them sent directly to the Department Head as soon as possible; applications without reference letters will not be considered.)
