Particulars of the Position: The Department has teaching needs in the areas of RLST 234.3 Chinese Religions (Fall), RLST 280.3 Methodologies and Approaches to Study of Religions (Fall), RLST 231.3 Confucianism Continuity and Change (Winter), RLST 235.3 Japanese Religions (Winter), and RLST 330.3 Daoism (Winter). The teaching load will consist of these five 3 cu courses over the fall and winter terms.

The appointment will be made at the rank of Lecturer or Instructor depending on the successful candidate's qualifications. Candidates must have a completed Master's or Doctoral Degree in Religious Studies or a Related Field.

- at least two letters of reference (please have them sent directly to the Department Head as soon as possible. Applications without reference letters will not be considered.)
