Newman Sounds Glee Club is a student organization at St. Thomas More College at the University of Saskatchewan. The glee club gathers students from across USask campus who want to be part of a non-auditioned choral group.

Dates:

- The contract for service agreement is for the period December 1st, 2023, through April 30th, 2024.

Stipend:

\$800 - \$1200 per term depending on qualifications and experience.

Duties

The Director:

- reports to the Manager of Student Experience and Enrolment at St. Thomas More College (Richard Medernach),
- directs/conducts at least one public concert per term for the glee club,
- chooses music/arrangements appropriate for the club, including but not limited to pop, jazz, seasonal, showtunes, and classic choral genres,
- ensures that music used by the Club is done so in accordance with copyright law,
- organizes and leads rehearsals. Expected rehearsal time for the Director will be once per week for an average of two hours at a minimum,
- designs choreography and/or recruits a choreographer for the club,
- helps recruit and retain members of the club,
- helps recruit and retain an accompanist.
