Assumption University is seeking an individual to teach **Catholicism and Social Justice (CATH 8100)** in the Fall 2024 semester.

Course Description: This course will examine the social justice tradition within the Catholic Church with emphasis on the “life and dignity of the human person.” In this course, students will explore how the Church engages with a host of social justice issues, such as poverty and homelessness, immigration, refugees and asylees, labour, human rights, reconciliation with Indigenous communities, the environment, and war and the pursuit of global peace.
