THE COLLEGE

Located in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, St. Thomas More College (STM) is a Catholic liberal arts college founded by the Congregation of Saint Basil in 1936. As a federated College with the University of Saskatchewan (USask), we maintain our own administration and receive our own provincial grants.

STM provides students with an intimate scholarly setting situated within the larger University of Saskatchewan (USask) campus. Offering a combination of smaller class sizes, award-winning faculty, social clubs, additional scholarship and bursary opportunities and a cafeteria for food offerings—students enjoy an environment that is the best of both worlds.


STM, in partnership with USask's College of Arts and Science, provides students with approximately 220 additional credit classes in the humanities and social sciences that they can select from—many unique to the campus. STM is academically integrated with the University of Saskatchewan. Any USask student may take STM courses, with credit counting toward their USask degrees.

STM offers courses in the following 20 subject areas: Anthropology; Archaeology; Classical, Medieval and Renaissance Studies; Catholic Studies; Dene; Economics; English; French; Hebrew; History; Interdisciplinary Studies; Latin; Literature; Philosophy; Political Studies; Psychology; Religious Studies; Sociology; Spanish, and Ukrainian. STM also offers five certificate programs distinct to campus - Catholic Studies, Peace Studies, Labour Studies, Religious Literacy, and Ukrainian Studies. STM is also recognized for its Engaged Learning opportunities including Community Service learning and Service and Justice committees; a student governing body within the College, literary journal club, and access to student advising, career-readiness, and College campus ministry support.

Two extensive building additions and renewal to the College include additional class-room space incorporating the latest technology; dedicated student study and lounge space; faculty research space; newly renovated library; and a large natural light Atrium for studying and gathering with friends.







THE OPPORTUNITY

Reporting to the President, the Dean serves as the College's senior academic officer and is responsible for leading the academic program, championing the Catholic intellectual tradition, and shaping the experience of both faculty and students.

Areas of responsibility include leading the academic program; faculty recruitment and career development; college strategic planning; managing the federation relationship between the College and the University of Saskatchewan; and advancing the College's public profile. The Dean will positively promote, actively engage in, and create an environment that stewards STM's Catholic mission, vision, and values.

The appointment of the Dean is for a five-year term with the possibility of renewal. The successful candidate will either hold tenure at the College or, if not, will be offered an academic position with tenure at the appropriate rank.

How will you contribute as Dean?


- Develop St. Thomas More College's role as a predominantly undergraduate liberal arts college at the University of Saskatchewan.

- An ability to work collegially with unionized faculty and within a unique governance model that includes a Board of Governors, Corporation, and Faculty Council.
- An ability and a willingness to work collaboratively as part of a Senior Administrative Team, including working creatively with complex issues, and balancing the competing demands of various constituencies.
- Experience in or an appreciation for working within a federated university/college system.
- Exceptional ability to build, develop, and manage relationships with faculty, staff, Senior Administrative team members, and key stakeholders within University of Saskatchewan and its affiliated institutions.

OUR SASKATOON, SASKATCHEWAN SETTING:

STM employees have numerous opportunities to participate in our community and collaborate in contributing to the College's Catholic identity and mission. Employees, just like our students, enjoy the advantages of a smaller College community located within the University of Saskatchewan, which has approximately 25,900 students and over 5,500 employees.

Saskatoon is located in the central region of Saskatchewan, straddling the South Saskatchewan River. Founded in 1882, it has grown into a cultural and economic hub with a population of over 310,000 residents.

The name "Saskatoon" is derived from the Cree word for the saskatoon berry, a fruit native to the region. Various grains, livestock, oil and gas, potash, uranium, gold, diamond, coal and their spin off industries fuel Saskatoon's economy. The world's largest publicly traded uranium company, Cameco, and the world's largest potash producer, Nutrien, have corporate headquarters in Saskatoon. Nearly two-thirds of the world's recoverable potash reserves are in the Saskatoon region.

Saskatoon's Innovation Place brings together almost 150 agriculture, information technology, and environmental, life sciences and agricultural biotechnology industries in a science or technology park setting - also home to the Canadian Light Source, Canada's national synchrotron facility.

Saskatoon is a city with a diverse and thriving economic base, a vibrant arts community, and a full range of leisure opportunities. Located on the beautiful University of Saskatchewan campus, STM is close to a variety of University of Saskatchewan facilities that attend to the health and wellbeing of students, staff, and faculty.
