DUTIES: The duties of a sessional lecturer include teaching, marking assignments and examinations, supervising the work of teaching assistants (if applicable), and having regular office hours.

STIPENDS: We offer competitive stipends and a compensation package that is comparable with the University of Saskatchewan.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Given the sensitive nature of the course material, previous university teaching experience in the area of the course is required for this position.
- Knowledge in the area of the course, as demonstrated by graduate transcripts or evidence of past lecturing experience is required.
- Experience outside the classroom, as related to the course content, will be considered an asset.
- Preference will be given to candidates with a Ph.D. in the discipline of Psychology. Candidates with a completed M.A. or M.Sc. in Psychology, or a College of Graduate & Postdoctoral Studies approved Ph.D. program transfer in Psychology may also be considered.
- Demonstrated cultural competence is also considered an asset.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Applicants must specify the courses for which they are applying. Candidates submitting application for more than one course are required to state a rank order of teaching preference. This information will be considered in the appointment process.
- Applicants must submit a cover letter, a current curriculum vitae, academic transcripts (as evidence of content expertise), documentation of teaching ability (if applicable), two letters of reference, and a written response to the College's Mission Statement which can be found at <https://stmcollege.ca/about-us/catholic-identity-and-mission.php>. Applicants who have taught for STM within the last 12 months must submit a cover letter and current curriculum vitae.
